1. What is your challenge?

- Describe the problem/challenge you want to solve in your project.
- What is the need that you are addressing?
- Be concrete, use simple language and example if needed

4. Who should be involved in your project?

- Who are the people/organisations that you absolutely need to work with to meet your goal?
- Who are the users of your solution, how will you reach them?
- Who will benefit from your project?

2. What is the main goal of your project?

• What is the solution (product or a service) that you are proposing to develop to overcome the challenge?

3. What activities will help you reach this goal?

• What are the key activities that your project requires to achieve the goal?

5. What resources and budget do you need?

- How much time is needed to achieve your goal?
- How much does it cost to run the activities?
- How many people and for how long will you need? What are the estimated travel & equipment costs for the project lifetime?

6. What's the expected result of your project?

- Describe what will change because of the project.
- What difference will your project make?
- · What is its added value?

Grants for Youth Projects and Travel in the Barents Region



The Norwegian Barents Secretariat (NBS) offers funding for youth projects in the Barents Region that foster collaboration and community development in the North. Our special BarentsUng travel support grant also provides financial aid to help young people experience new perspectives through travel.

Funding criteria:

- Projects must help build stronger communities in Northern Norway.
- Projects should promote collaboration between Northern Norway, Northern Finland, Northern Sweden, Iceland, Greenland and the Faroe Islands.
- · Youth involvement and leadership are key.
- Travel support is available for young individuals under 30 in Northern Norway under the BarentsUng grant.

When to apply:

Calls for projects open all year around

Budget:

No upper limit. But we only cover the costs associated with participants from Northern Norway and the other areas in the Norwegian part of Sápmi.
