WP3.1 Field Day report from Teagasc, Oak Park, Carlow, Ireland

As part of the Crop Science Department, Teagasc's annual In-Service Training and Oat Field Day, a field trip was planned for agronomists, advisors, and farmers. The OatFrontiers trials' overall purpose and objective were explained during the event. The attendees were shown the micro plots, which contain a variety of oat germplasms, and the yield plots, which include 28 released oat varieties from Ireland, Germany, Norway, Finland, Sweden, and the UK.

Candidates also received answers to their questions concerning agronomics, the viability of trials, and prospective future breeding initiatives during Q&A sessions.
