Interreg NPA and Interreg Aurora have decided to work more closely together and to facilitate synergies and clustering among Arctic and near-Arctic stakeholders.



Projects funded by either programme during the funding period 2021-2027 are invited to join efforts and submit a clustering project application that leads to better outputs and results and a greater outreach for the dissemination of the results from the two programmes.

Clustering projects are expected to give a higher profile to topics relevant to people living in the Arctic and contribute to the practical implementation of the EU Arctic Policy in communities.

Specific Terms of reference are published on this webpage for Transnational clustering projects, outlining the conditions for funding. It is important to always read and check the terms of reference before applying!

Project applications can be submitted between 8th September 2025 and 6th October 2025.







Application for support from the Programme should be submitted through the electronic monitoring system, Min Ansökan, in English.

Please read the <u>Calls for applications</u> for more information. To guide applicants in the application process, there are <u>supporting materials</u>.

Reporting and application for payment for funded projects should be submitted through the electronic monitoring system, Min Ansökan for Swedish and Finnish project partners. Norwegian partners should use the electronic monitoring system, Regionalforvalting.no (RF).
